

# Emerald's dump point relocated

IT MIGHT lack the sparkle of Carnarvon Gorge and the Sapphire Gemfields, but the Central Highlands now boasts another valuable tourism product.

Emerald's dump point has been relocated to the Emerald Showgrounds and has been fully upgraded to the latest and most efficient grey and black water disposal system.

The new site also provides easy access and allows for the biggest of rigs requiring wide turning circles or backing space.

Central Highlands Tourism Development officer Peter Grigg is thrilled with the final product.

market, and dump points are an essential part of their trip," Mr Grigg says.

"It's fantastic that they no longer have to put up with the outdated, often disabled

and non-user-friendly service that was previously located near the Visitor Information Centre."

The upgrade was funded by the Central Highlands

Regional Council.

Dump points are used to dispose of vehicles' black (toilet) and grey (sink and shower) water.

Other projects currently under way for 2016 include a 101 Things to See and Do brochure that will showcase business products that appeal to visitors, ranging from attractions and accommodation to goods and services.
