Building Business Resilience: Dysart

As part of the Farm Business Resilience Program, Department of Agriculture and Fisheries conducting a free Building Business Resilience workshop for grains and mixed producers in Rolleston.

This workshop will help to:

- identify practices that will help you to be better prepared for a changing climate, including drought
- review or develop an on-farm plan to prioritise these practices
- improve your knowledge and skills to effectively integrate these practices into your enterprise

The workshop is also the first step in the development of a farm business resilience plan. This plan is a mandatory requirement when applying for drought preparedness through QRIDA (Queensland Rural and Industry Development Authority) - up to \$50,000 in grants and \$250,000 as low-cost loans.

To assist you with the preparedness against drought and dry conditions, DAF invites you to the workshop.
